Dear CLIENT,

SPEAK ONLY WITH YOUR ATTORNEY ABOUT YOUR CASE

The safest course of action is to only speak to me about your case. Any statements made by you can be introduced into the court of law. There are certain legal privileges to a spouse, clergy, and medical professionals, i.e therapists, but these are not absolute. Confer with me, your attorney, before disclosing any information to anyone. Parents, significant others, family and friends can be subpoenaed to testify against you.

DO NOT SPEAK WITH LAW ENFORCEMENT ABOUT YOUR CASE

If you are approached or detained by the police, do not be intimidated by their questions. Inform the police of the following information and terminate the conversation:

If you become incarcerated, law enforcement can place listening devices in your prison cells. Law enforcement can also place a confidential informant in your cell to receive information from you and use it against you in your case. Likewise, do not talk about your case on the prison phone system. All calls are monitored, and the Solicitor's office will have your calls reviewed for any incriminating statements to use against you at trial. **More people are sitting in jail because of what they have said, instead of what others have said about them.** Again, the safest course of action is to only speak to me about your case.
